MOTORIZED VEHICLE USE ON THE POLLY ANN TRAIL PROHIBITED

Dear Polly Ann Trail Users:

This summer we have been experiencing a high number of motorized vehicles on the Polly Ann Trail. The Polly Ann Trail is designated as a non-motorized trail, and the use of motorized vehicles creates an unsafe environment for everyone on the trail. No motorized vehicles are allowed on the trail except those that are being used as a personal assistive mobility device for a person with a disability, and class 1 e-bikes, as designated by the sticker on the bike, unmodified. Additionally, the speed limit on the trail is 15 mph.

Motorized transportation that is NOT allowed on the trail includes, but is not limited to:

- Electric or gas golf carts
- Snowmobiles
- Mopeds
- Segways
- Hoverboards
- Electric Skateboards
- Class 2 and Class 3 e-bikes (including modified or disabled throttle)
- Electric Unicycles
- Electric or gas Scooters
- Electric or gas motorcycles
- Electric of gas tricycles
- Off-road scooters
- One-wheels
- Dirt Bikes

This is not a comprehensive list. Any other type of personal transportation device that requires a motor is considered a motorized vehicle and is not allowed on State of Michigan non-motorized trails.

Additionally, if you require a personal assistive mobility device for a disability, the device is allowable only for that individual person, not that individual person and their spouse, friends, or family if there is more than one seat. Only the person with a disability may use a personal assistive mobility device on the trail.
